This week in Nursery we have started our new topic - Big Wide World. We have spent this week exploring the nursery and some of the school grounds. This has allowed the children to explore their immediate environment and look closely at things they might not have noticed before.

Thanks to the lovely weather, we have been able to get outside on the playground and the field, playing with our old friends and making new ones. The pre schoolers have had a great time interacting with the school children on the field after lunch, whilst the younger ones have started to form some new friendships.

On Tuesday, the children got to bring in a bike or a scooter from home and they rode around the playground on a 'pretend' journey. The children were very excited as they headed off to the seaside, the shops and somebody said they were riding their bike to Morocco!! They were all very good at keeping themselves safe, wearing their helmets and showed off some amazing skills as they moved around the playground.

As part of exploring the world around us the children played in a gardening sensory tray, where they used a range of tools and equipment and each had a go at planting their own runner bean seed. We are going to be looking after our seeds and hopefully watching them grow over the next few weeks. A very popular choice this week has been the water tray, where the children have been having fun splashing around in warm bubbly water, pouring, filling and trying to get the staff wet!! We introduced syringes and pipettes on one of the days, where they needed to think about how to collect the water and then put their strength and skills to the test. Some of the children loved facing a new challenge, whilst others weren't so keen.

We have finished the week with our weekly walk down to forest school and we're busy exploring the area in more detail - looking closely at the leaves, trees and bugs that we found. We have also played hide and seek, played on the rope swing and collected sticks.

Toby, Olly H, Thomas E and Joseph have all been awarded the Paddle Award from British Canoeing Association - a massive well done to you all!




