We do need some volunteers to man the fair - either 2.30-3.00pm or 3-4pm - each day.

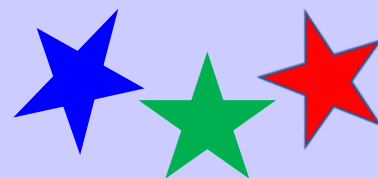

Monday morning we took all of the children up to the hall for their weekly PE session. This week Katrina has been getting the children to move in different ways to music. They have been hopping, jumping, twirling, and swirling whilst waving rainbow ribbons and colourful streamers in the air. The children all look forward to their Monday morning treat of hot buttered toast at snack time.

Kelley was looking at numbers with the children on Tuesday. Counting is something that we do regularly with the children in nursery as part of our daily routine. So today we were looking at what the numbers look like when they are written down and had a go at matching the number to the quantity. The boys thought it was great when they got to count the cars!!

On Wednesday, Katrina introduced the children to the story 'We are going on a Bear Hunt' which is a definite favourite with the children. They joined in with the actions throughout the story and had a go at retelling the story using some of the pictures from the book. They also got to take the big bears through the gloopy mud (cornflour and cocoa powder) that was in the sensory tray and got themselves rather messy!!

Lauren continued looking at going over, under and through things with the children on Thursday, they got to work their way around a special circuit that let them move around nursery, tiptoeing over stepping stones and crawling through a tunnel. In the sensory tray there was a sandy landscape with a train track set up. This allowed the children to push the trains along the track, go over and under the bridge as well as drive through the tunnels they had made.

To finish the week off, the children have all headed down to forest school to take part in their very own bear hunt. They have been splashing through muddy puddles, swishy swashing through the long grass and trip trapping through the forest trees, searching high and low for Mr Bear.

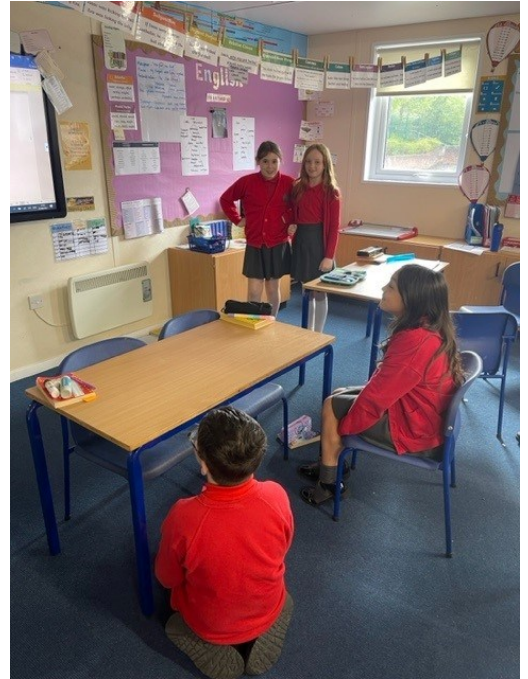

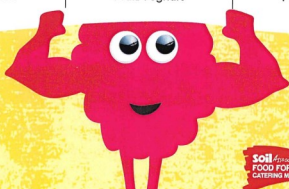

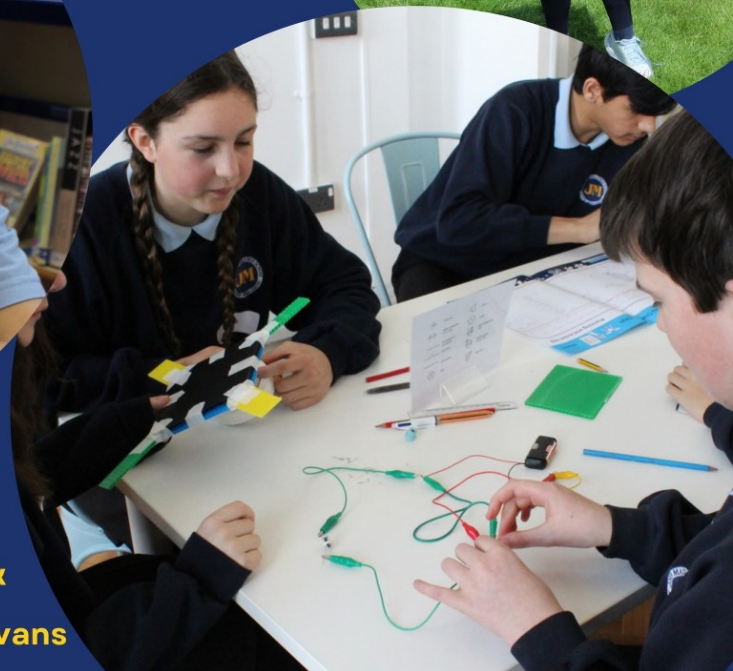
