The apple juice labels have been judged and here are our winning designs!



Please consider buying your Christmas Tree from Temple Court Farm in Bosbury this year - they will donate 10% of your purchase price to FoCS if you ask them to!





On Monday, the children joined Kelley in the hall for a PE session. They had to listen carefully as they played a game of 'Gerald the Giraffe Says.....' The children were great at following all the different instructions. Then they got to show us their funky dance moves, in a game of musical statues. All their hard work meant they could sit down after and enjoy some hot buttered toast and fruit juice.

The children were describing jungle animals with Lauren on Tuesday. After picking an animal out of the bag they used their own words to describe the animal to their friends. They also got to colour in pictures of the animals that had been described. In the afternoon, we all joined in with a cosmic yoga session, that took us on a trip into the jungle.

Katrina was getting the children involved in a colour sorting and matching activity on Wednesday. They took it in turns to help sort the objects in the sorting tray into the correctly coloured bowls and had a go at finding matching items. Outside, the children were getting creative, making their own music, using pots, pans, and wooden spoons.

On Thursday, the children were size ordering jungle animals with Kelley. They got to practise their fine motor skills, as they cut out and stuck the animals into the correct order. 

Collective Worship with Ken Hart

On Thursday in Collective Worship we were visited by the minister of Cradley Chapel, Mr. Ken Hart. He shared with us the plight of many orphan children in Sierra Leone, commonly called "Street Children" because the streets are where they live. We watched a video and were shown photographs. Cradley Chapel supports an orphanage and school over there, called Bethesda, (which means house of mercy) which has been opened to help some of these children. The chapel sends children's clothes there each September and we would ask you to remember them when sorting through your children's clothes. We will make a collection for them next year.



Monday - Jacket Potatoes


Tuesday - Pasta
