

#### **NURSERY NEWS**





On Monday the nursery children started their week in the hall for PE. This week as part of our topic of 'People who help us' we are looking at how firefighters keep us safe. The children have practised 'Get down low and go, go, go' for if there is ever a fire in their home. After some amazing crawling from the nursery children they all took on the role of a firefighter and completed an obstacle course. They were brilliant and showed us their amazing balancing and jumping skills.

On Tuesday the children practised 'stop, drop and roll' with Katrina as well as thinking about what appliances in their homes could get hot.

Wednesday was a busy day in nursery! The children went to watch Class 3 perform their assembly. The children really enjoyed it and all thought Class 3 were brilliant. Once back in nursery, the children painted their hands to make firefighter handprints with Kelley.

Thursday was all about road safety. The children joined Lauren with a small world set up and they looked for safe places to cross the road. We talked about the importance of 'stop, look and listen' when near traffic.

The children went to Forest School with Katrina on Friday morning. They collected different natural resources such as sticks and leaves to make nests for birds. The children picked which tree they'd like their nest put in and sprinkled some bird seed in them for the birds!

#### Class 4 Trip on Severn Valley Railway to Bewdley Museum



The children had a marvellous time learning about life on the home front during WWII and the experience of being evacuated. They particularly enjoyed the train journey, trying their hand at rag rugging, visiting a real Anderson Shelter that was used during the war and playing some of the games children from the 1940s would have played. The children were not keen on the idea of sharing bath water with their whole family, especially if they are the youngest! The girls were indignant at the thought of being expected to help with laundry and housework while the boys were sent out to play in the 1940s. The museum was a real gem with so much to see and do.
