

NURSERY NEWS






Monday morning, the nursery children all headed up to the hall for their weekly PE session. This week Kelley led a warmup session with the children that involved them stretching and curling. After being shown how to throw a beanbag carefully underarm, the children got to have a go themselves. Except, this time, they had to try and throw the beanbag into a hula hoop that was placed in front of them. Everyone worked really hard at getting the beanbags into the hoops and scored lots of points!! In the afternoon, we learnt a little bit about 'Diwali - The Festival of Light' and the children got to make some sparkly diva lamps and enjoyed some edible firework sticks. On Tuesday, the children were taking part in shape activities with Katrina. There were opportunities to play and explore with different 2D and 3D shapes, allowing the children to practice matching shapes that were the same and to familiarize themselves with what the shape names are as well as what they look like.

Kelley was using the interactive screen and IPads with the children on Wednesday. They were exploring how they could create their own 'artwork' onto a screen in a variety of colours, using their own individual movements. The children that had a go, showed independence and used the apps confidently throughout. Lauren was sharing the nursery rhyme 'Wind the Bobbin Up' with the children on Thursday, whilst encouraging and supporting them to join in with the actions. They also had a go at thinking of rhyming words they could use instead of the original ones.

We have celebrated Children in Need today by making spotty cupcakes with Katrina in the kitchen and have also been adding spots to Pudsey Bear using finger paints.


Class 4 have had a lovely week they've produced some brilliant
