Years 3 and 4 Residential Visit to Ironbridge, Shropshire **29th April – 1st May 2026**

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am pleased to inform you that we have booked Coalport Youth Hostel for our Year 3 & 4 Residential. The total cost per.pupil will be £260.00, which will cover insurance, travel, food and activities. We will visit Carding Mill Valley, Ironbridge, Jackfield Tile Museum and Blists Hill Victorian Town. The payments will appear on Arbor very soon.

Although the total cost is £260.00, we have applied for charity funding which we hope to receive, which will reduce the cost. If we are successful, the final payment will be altered to reflect this, so please resist paying for everything in one payment!

Deposits should be paid by Friday 14th November, this amount will be non-refundable. The final payment date is Friday 13th February, after which amendments to number of participants cannot be changed and payments will be non-refundable.

This is a voluntary payment, however school is unable to subsidise the full cost and if we do not receive sufficient contributions the trip will not be able to go ahead.

Families in receipt of Free School Meals will be charged a reduced rate of £60.00 in 3 £20.00 amounts. The additional cost will be met by school.
