Covid 19 Reminder

DfE Guidance: If your child has one or more of the following symptoms, then they must not come to school and you must take them for a PCR test. They must stay off school until they have the test result.

The main symptoms are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you
 cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

We appreciate your support with this, and keeping everyone safe.

Class 1 had a treat last Friday for filling their marble jar right up to the top!


They enjoyed grooving and shimmying in their very own disco along with disco ball!
