If you or anyone you know is interested in these positions please contact the school office for more details by Friday 25th June. Thank you.



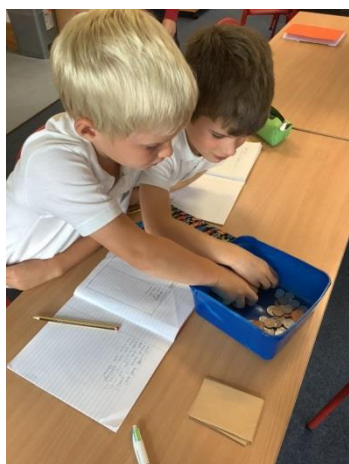
# FOREST SCHOOL
