We all headed out onto the field on Monday morning for a PE session with Kelley and Donna. The children were working on their ball skills and got to practise their throwing and catching, as well as kicking the ball and trying to aim for the goal.

On Tuesday morning, we looked at pictures of children from around the world and chatted about how they did things the same and different to us. We also used the globe to point out the countries that they were from. Due to the fire alarm sounding, the nursery children got to meet some firemen, who kindly showed the children around the fire engine. They were all very excited about this and got to see some interesting things that a fireman may need.

Wednesday was another bright, sunny day and the children spent most of their time playing outside. They worked well together to create a Jurassic world, that was full of dinosaurs and the children used some good mathematical language to describe their sizes. Back in the spring, the children planted some flower seeds. These have now grown into some pretty looking flowers and the children have been taking it in turns this week, using the watering can to water them.

On Thursday, Katrina continued our Big Wide World theme and prepared some special snacks, including poppadoms from India, prawn crackers from China and tortilla chips from South America, for the children to taste.
