Dear Parents and Carers,

Friends of Cradley School (FoCS) is a group of adults who are in some way connected to Cradley school, either as parents, extended family, carers, and teachers. We plan events through the school year to raise funds which are distributed to the classes to subsidise school trips for example. These events include the much loved disco, the summer fair, the Christmas pop up shop and smaller events such as the village fetes and Marshmallow Fridays.

We are having our annual general meeting for FoCS on Monday 2nd October at 8pm via zoom, and we'd be absolutely thrilled for as many people to attend the meeting as possible which will be only 40 minutes long.

We especially would like you to consider any help you're able to offer FoCS.

Any contribution with the events is more than welcome, however, at this point, our committee is a little thin on the ground.

Our wonderful secretary, Annie, has moved on in July when her youngest moved to high school and our treasurer, Liz has done a great job of streamlining our finances, but is stepping down from the role.

Currently, we (Lucy and Kirstie) are co-chairs. We both intend staying on the committee, and are flexible with which roles we will take. However, rules and regulations are in place and we cannot function as a fundraising team without at least three people on the committee.

We have to have all three roles filled – someone as chair, someone as secretary, and another person as treasurer. In an ideal situation, each of the positions would have a co-option.

Despite notices in the school newsletter for a year, knowing that Annie was leaving, we've had no one come forward to fill these roles and so we are making a final plea to encourage anyone who is thinking they might be able to offer a few hours a month to attend the meeting and step forward.

Additionally, you can speak to Jane in the office or to Kirstie or Lucy at the school gates to see what might be involved. There's less than you think!

At this point, the only fundraising plans we have are the Christmas cards. All other fundraising, and all the events that FoCS subsidises are currently on hold because it would not be fair to suggest we are holding certain events to then cancel.

The reality is unless we get a full committee in place by Monday evening we will not be allowed to fundraise.

We will not be having a pop-up shop for Christmas.

We will not be having a disco.

We will not be having a certain man in red turn up to Christmas dinner this year handing out treats.

We will not be having Easter egg colouring competitions.

We will not be having a summer fair.

Last year we were able to give each class £500 towards school trips. This will also have to stop, because we won't be able to fundraise.

On Monday evening, we either need a full committee in place, or unfortunately, we will have no choice but to fold.

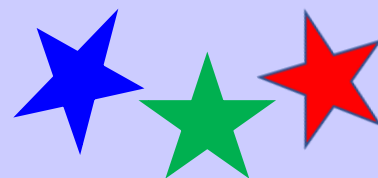

NURSERY NEWS



Here we are at the end of another nursery week, the weather is changing, the nights are getting darker and Autumn is well and truly on its way!!

On Monday, Kelley started the week off with a PE lesson that was based around cars and traffic lights. The children were moving around the hall at different speeds, making the most of the space available to them and showing care by not bumping into anyone on their way around. We then all joined in with a game of traffic lights, where the children had to stop, get ready and go - depending on the colour of the light.

Katrina was encouraging the children to listen out for sounds on Tuesday. The children were all very good at recognising lots of different animals, from the noises that they made and could identify many everyday noises that they hear in and around the home. They also got to be very creative, making their own sounds using a selection of musical instruments.

On Wednesday, the nursery children were looking at some basic emotions with Kelley. During circle time, we all sat down and talked about how we know when people are happy or sad and what we can do to help them. We also looked at things that might make us feel happy or sad. The children got to use Mr Potato-head to make some funny looking faces and were also looking at their own reflections in mirrors. In the afternoon, we sang happy songs together and played musical instruments.

Thursday was a numbers day, where Lauren played games with the children using a dice in the sensory sand tray. They took it in turns to roll the dice and have a go at counting the spots. Some of the children went on to find and count out the same number of hidden buttons and put them into a treasure pot. Numbers have also been explored through puzzles, playing dominoes and using the numicon pieces to make patterns.

This morning, the children have been off on their weekly welly walk down to forest school. They had so much fun on their bear hunt last week, that they asked to go on another. So Lauren has taken them back through the long, wavy grass and the thick oozy mud to the narrow gloomy cave, to see if they can find the bear!!



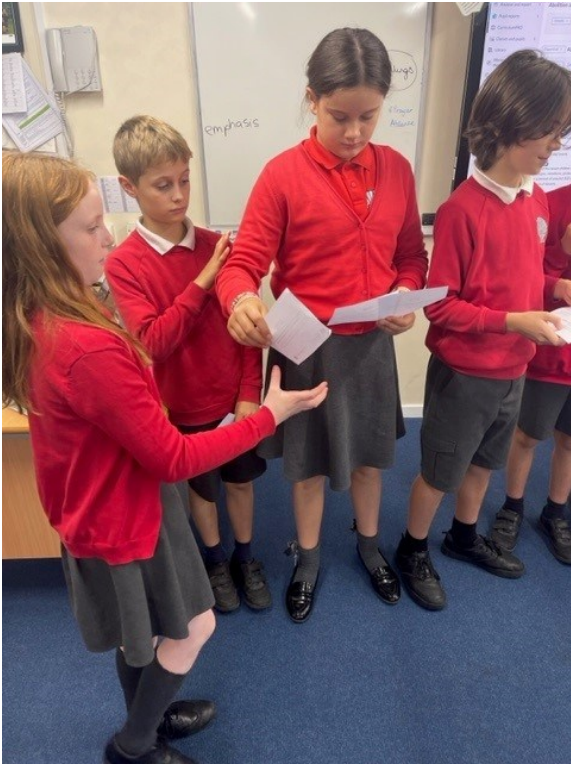

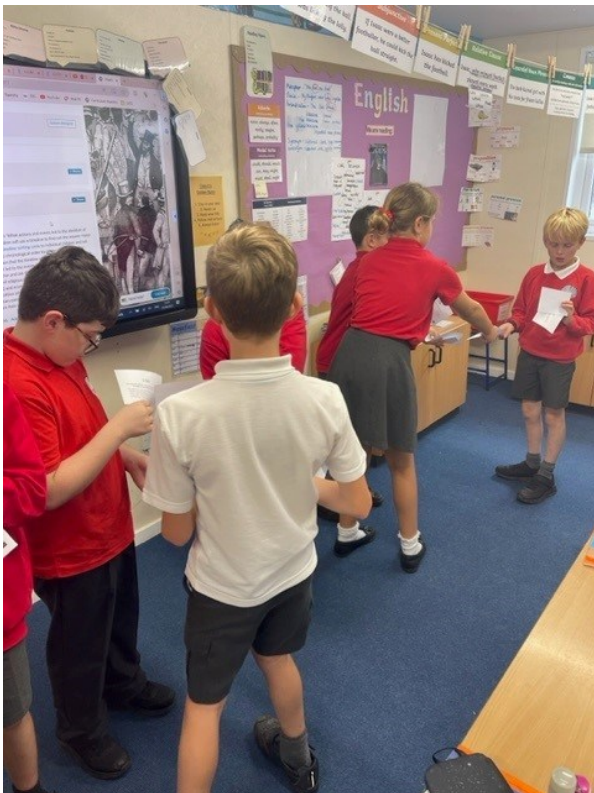
Class 4 have been making models of the sun, Earth and the moon this week in science.

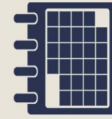
