Dear Parents and Carers,

Today your child has brought home their school report. This is a reflection on the last year and a summary of their attainment. Please see below an explanation of this to help you to understand. Children in Year 2 and Year 6 will also receive their SATS results and the data for our school compared to children of the same age nationally. The National figures are first drafts and when they are ratified we will add the information to our school website.

Early Years

This is now reported as being Emerging (not achieved) and Expected (has achieved the Early Learning Goal). There are some children working above the expected standard but we are not allowed to report on that. It has been noted in our internal data and will be used as a baseline for Year 1. Children must be at the expected standard in all the Prime areas and the Specific areas of reading, writing, number and numerical patterns to reach a 'Good level of development'.

Year 1 Phonics

Children took a National test in June. The score is out of a possible 40. Children who scored 32 or above passed the test.

Year 2

Children in Year 2 sat National tests at the end of May. The results recorded are a mixture of test scores and teacher assessment. Results are recorded as working towards the standard, at the expected standard or exceeding.

Year 4

Children in Year 4 took a National Times Table Test online. There were 25 questions. Children who scored 20 or more achieved well but there was no pass mark this year.

Years 1 to 5

Children are assessed throughout the year, their attainment level is a combination of test scores and teacher assessment.

Children who are recorded as being at Yr3 S have achieved the standard for children in Year 3. Children at Yr4 W are working towards the Year 4 standard and children working at Y5 E have exceeded the standard for children in Year 5.

Year 6

Year 6 children across the country sat tests in May. These papers were sent away to be externally marked. Children who got a scaled score of 100 or more reached the standard for Year 6. Children scoring 110 achieved a standard above expected and are believed to be working at greater depth.

Year 5

Class 5 Miss Tuckwood and Mrs Whittaker

Year 6

Mrs Crane and Mrs Henry will be teaching Year 1 and 3 Maths and English respectively again this year.

Mrs Poppleton, Ms Reckling and Mrs Leven Kildare will be supporting children with additional needs both in the classroom and through Thrive.

Class 4 will have a long term supply teacher for the Autumn term while we advertise for a permanent teacher to start in January. Mrs Hurley will move with them to give continuity. The new teacher will be confirmed by the end of Wednesday and we will let parents and children know. Miss Tuckwood will move into Class 5 with her Year 5 children. She knows the children well and will be able to begin the year ahead of the game as they work towards SATS in the Summer Term.

We have made decisions regarding classes and staffing after lots of consideration and are confident that we have everyone best placed for a successful year.
