# NURSERY NEWS



Welcome back to the second half of the Summer Term. We have a new topic of 'People Who Help Us' and each week we're looking at a different area within this topic.

This week we have started off learning about dentists and how they help us to keep our teeth clean and healthy.

On Monday the children went to the hall for their PE lesson with Lauren. They watched a video about the upcoming Commonwealth Games and learn that this year it will be held in Birmingham. The children looked at the different sports that happen there and then practised their throwing and catching skills. They worked in pairs practising accuracy and then had a go at throwing beanbags into hoops.

On Tuesday the children practised their counting and number recognition skills. Katrina had made a large mouth and the children had to order the numbered teeth correctly.

On Wednesday the children had a go at cleaning some teeth! They had to use toothbrushes and toothpaste to make the teeth sparkly and clean. We also had lots of builders in nursery on Wednesday! The children dressed up as builders and used some playdough and wooden blocks to build their own brick walls! They used different tools such as hammers to make the bricks level.

On Thursday the children practised their cutting skills with Donna. They cut up different pictures of a child cleaning their teeth and then stuck them down in the correct order. The children chatted about how they cleaned their teeth at home and we talked about using a timer to make sure they cleaned them for long enough.

On Friday the children finished their week in Forest School with Katrina. The children took their buckets on a walk to find different sized leaves. Once back in nursery, they dried their leaves off and sorted them by colour and size. They also had a go at ordering their leaves in size from the smallest leaf to the biggest leaf.

Yesterday, Class 3 had a wonderful time at The Black Country Living Museum learning about life in the Victorian Times and during The Industrial Revolution.

We took part in a strict Victorian lesson where Mrs Crane was told off for not knowing the alphabet and Miss

We also learnt about what it would have been like down the mines and got to see some examples of how dangerous it was!
