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

Note – the Rags 2 Riches collection on 12th February has been cancelled. The next collection date will hopefully be Friday 21st May.






Message from Mrs Jones


This week in Nursery we have been busy exploring our new theme for this term, 'Under the Sea'. We've all enjoyed exploring our sensory tray that has been filled with bubbly water and sea animals for us all to learn about and we even filled the tray with coloured sea worms (spaghetti). We have enjoyed playing outside in the fresh air and have particularly enjoyed our mud slide on the field; most days we have got our water proofs on and headed outside to slide around in the mud. We have also been busy using our imaginations and role playing nursery trips around the world; we've been to the beach, dinosaur land, roller coaster rides and trips to farms on our imaginary bus. We have been practising our balancing skills this week as well with our new balance beams for nursery, the children have loved walking over the beams and challenging themselves with different obstacles. We have finished off our week with cooking on Friday where we've made under the sea biscuits.

PE Challenge

As part of your home learning we have started a challenge to get active in lockdown at Cradley. Each day, throughout the week, there is a different activity set which work different muscles. In addition to this, KS1 have been challenged to be active for at least 30 minutes a day and 60 minutes a day for KS2 - this could be walking the dog, bouncing on the trampoline or even helping adults with the vacuuming! Every full 2 weeks the challenge is completed a little reward will be earned. There are also some participation rewards too. This is to support children in getting the NHS recommended 60minutes of activity each day, including working different muscle groups.
