

Welcome back to the second half of our Autumn term, where the nursery children will be looking at 'marvelous machines' in the run up to the Christmas season. We started the week off with a Bonfire night themed PE session with Lauren. The children got to dance around the darkened hall with colorful ribbons and streamers, making circles and shapes with their bodies as they recreated the actions of the firework displays that were playing on the large screen.

On Tuesday, Lauren took the children up into the kitchen to look at some of the 'marvelous machines' that we can use to help us cook and keep food warm. Whilst in the kitchen, the children got to experience the cooker and the microwave in action, as they helped Lauren cook some sausages for their morning snack. Back in nursery, the children were all very excited to taste the yummy hot dogs they had just helped to make and spent snack time chatting about what they could cook next.

'What can we use to take a photograph?' was the question Katrina asked the children on Wednesday. After a circle time chat about the different ways we can take a picture and the different things we can use, the children got to have a go themselves. Using the IPads, each of the children were supported to take their own photographs in and around nursery, before sharing them with their friends. Our story this week has been 'The Gruffalo' and on Thursday, Kelley looked at how well the children could remember the story. Using pictures from the book, the children worked together to tell me what happened at the start, middle and end of the story. They also did a great job of filling in the words that had been purposefully left out.

During this half term, the nursery children will be spending their Friday morning's 'cooking.' Today, Lauren has been helping the children to create a poppy style biscuit, using red and black icing. They have also watched a video clip about 'Remembrance Day' and talked about what it means.
