Environment Week

This week in Nursery we've been busy exploring our pumpkin tray with lentils made by Lauren and have been having a go at painting our own pumpkins with Katrina. We've enjoyed making our own play dough this week and the children have even taught Sam how to make play dough as well. Thursday was very exciting because we had a tractor come into see usl All of the children loved having a sit on the tractor. We've ended our last week with a fire in forest school with Mrs Gleaves, singing campfire songs and munching on toasted marshmallows and sausages.



Class 1

This week we have been looking at oral storytelling. We have listened to several versions of *The Little Red Hen* and discussed why versions might be different. We've played Chinese Whispers to show how this might change a story. On Tuesday we visited the Hive in Worcester for a storytelling session on stage and came away with some bread! In maths this week we have been counting autumnal objects and recognising numerals. We have also been adding two numbers together using a number line or by counting on from the bigger number. Class 1 have learned about the PANTS rule, as set out by the NSPCC to keep children safe, and we've used the Bee-bots again to create algorithms and to recap what debugging means. We have welcomed back Miss Conner who will be team teaching in Class 1 until the end of term.

Well done to all the new Reception children who have completed their first half-term at school. You should all feel very proud of all the things you have achieved so far. Have a well-deserved break over half-term and come back refreshed for our Nativity season!



Class 2

This week in Class 2 we have been working on a hedgehog story in English lessons. It is based on *Hodge the Hedgehog* by Kate Petty and we have been using some of the facts we have learned about looking after hedgehogs to help. In maths we have been using Tara Maths games to learn our times tables in a fun and interactive way, and in topic we have found out about Amy Johnson.

Class 3

This week we finally completed the story of Beowulf, and also read through a different version which Adam brought in to share with the class. We all thought it was very sad when (spoiler alert!) Beowulf the brave was eventually slain by a fierce dragon. There has been much glue spread around the room in the big push to complete the Anglo-Saxon houses (almost done...and so is Mrs Shepherd!). In music we tried out the boom whackers, new instruments to the school; great fun! In RE we have been thinking of ways to care for the wonderful world which God has made, and in science we have been making mini compost bins.

Class 4

This week Class 4 had a lovely time performing in our class assembly and showing off what we have been doing in the classroom - thanks to everyone who came to support us. We have also been completing our end of term tests in Maths, Reading and SPAG this week. We have gone on a number hunt and worked together to complete lots of different calculations, applying the skills we have learned to different situations. In the afternoons Year 5 went swimming and Year 4 had a lovely time at the Beeline Storytelling Festival at the Hive. We have learned about the bible through role-plays in RE, and looked at the physical and human landscape of the Grand Canyon in topic.





Class 5

This week, as well as completing our half-termly assessments, we have worked hard on our poetry/film project - and it's nearly finished! In maths, we have been working on percentages. In science, we were interested to compare the work and explorations of Charles Darwin and Alfred Wallace who both came to very similar conclusions in the 19th century about the origin of species. In R.E. we researched the work of three charities whose work is inspired by religious faith and teaching.
